## How Many Days Till Christmas ?

This will be asked many times in the coming weeks. But will this question cause us to think about preparing for the HOLIDAY SEASON or the HOLY DAY, CHRISTMAS? In all the rushing around, it is easy to forget that Jesus is the reason for the season. This is why the Church provides us with the time of the **PRE-CHRISTMAS FAST**, **PYLYPIVKA** sometimes called ADVENT, which begins on **November 15** in our Ukrainian Catholic Church.

This period of preparation is a time of expectation, a time to ready our hearts for celebrating the presence of the Lord in the child born in Bethlehem. Society tells us to prepare and expect for another reason. The parking lots at the malls will be full, there will be more traffic on the roads, and checkout lines will be busier. Covenant of Care/Safeguarding 2020 Training Update Who needs to complete safeguarding training?

All persons including clergy, religious, staff or volunteers who work in Eparchial ministries organizations, or affiliated organizations or parishes/parish organizations, who are in positions of trust. The Safeguarding policy p. 8-9 (https://www.skeparchy.org/wordpress/wp-content/uploads/2020/10/Eparchial-Safeguarding-Policy-Final-Version-06-October-01-2020.pdf) defines positions of trust as follows:

A 'trust' position will include those:

• working in an unsupervised setting where ministry, food, transportation or other necessities could be provided to minors and/or vulnerable adults,


having access to confidential information, and/or

· being entrusted with control of keys, church property and money.

Trust positions also include, but are not limited to, Children's or Youth Ministry (including all camps, volunteer driving, Altar Server or Children of Mary Programs, Children's/Youth Choirs, Catechism and Sacramental Prep), and Eucharistic/Pastoral Care Ministry to the sick and shut-ins.

An Open Letter to the members of St. Mary's Parish, Yorkton:

November 3, 2021

Glory be to Jesus Christ!

As Vicar of Properties for the Eparchy of Saskatoon, I want to share with you some of the exciting things that are happening as the Parish Monastery Committee and the Redemptorist Fathers work on the plan. First of all, congratulations on your "almost unanimous" decision at the June 27, 2021 general parish meeting. You decided then to accept the proposal from the Redemptorists. The proposal had two parts, one part was to accept the transfer of titles of all the Yorkton properties and the second part was to accept that the Redemptorists will cover the costs of demolishing the monastery. This was a good decision, since the costs and liabilities associated with the monastery building (insurance, utilities, maintenance, etc.), are huge and would fall exclusively on you. Even without these extra costs, we all know that the parish membership is changing and the costs of everything are rising. This decision was a good thing and all should be happy about it, even though we will miss our beautiful Monastery.

The demolition is expected to proceed in early spring of 2022 and there is a lot of preparation involved. The monastery committee has been working hard, in conjunction with Marusia Kobrinsky, Fr. Michael, Doreen Clark and me. Our job is to assess the impact that the demolition will have on the parish, to evaluate the actions that need to be taken and to do (or delegate) the work that needs to be done.

Another big step was deciding where the new offices will go. We considered 8 options and our favorite choice was the church basement where the chapel and storage area are now located. If the architect can make it happen and we can afford it, then the work begins.

The Redemptorists are going to have a big auction in January for the sale of the contents of the monastery. You will all be invited to participate. Before that happens there are 3 big jobs: first the Parish gets dibs on what they would like to keep, second the sacred items will be collected, catalogued and stored for distribution in the Eparchy. (Of course, some of the sacred items will also be decommissioned by burying or burning as is our church custom.) and third there is a lot of "garbage" to get rid of, like old mattresses and broken/worn out furniture.

Titles to the lands and buildings are currently registered in the name of the Redemptorist order (Church, Monastery, Redeemer's Voice building, Garages, and Cultural Center) and will be transferred to the parish in the new year. That means the parish together with the Eparchy, as the new owners, can consider the possibilities of subdividing and selling one or more parcels of property if you so choose.

Another big step is to provide a residence for the serving clergy. For now, the Redemptorists live in the Maple Ave duplex and are not charging a housing allowance. When the Monastery is down then the parish will be required to pay a housing allowance. Some day (some year) in the future, when the Redemptorists leave the Yorkton district and the secular priests arrive, you will have to pay them a housing allowance or provide a residence.

I wish to assure you of the Eparchy's continued monitoring, support and encouragement as you continue on with this massive project. Marusia and I will continue to be open to help the Parish and the Redemptorist Fathers to ask questions and offer suggestions. Change is never easy, but if we all work and pray together, with God's help, we can make a smooth transition.

Tropar, tone 7: By Your cross You destroyed death;\* You opened

Paradise to the thief;\* You changed the lamentation of the myrrhbearers to joy,\* and charged the apostles to proclaim\* that You are risen, O Christ, our God,\* offering great mercy to the world.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and for ever and ever. Amen!

Kondak, tone 7: No longer shall the dominion of death be able to hold humanity,\* for Christ went down shattering and destroying its powers.\* Hades is bound.\* The prophets exult with one voice.\* The Savior has come for those with faith, saying:\* "Come forth, O faithful, to the resurrection!"

## Prokimen, tone 7 :

The Lord will give strength to His people; the Lord will bless His people with peace. *Verse: Bring to the Lord, O you sons of God; bring to the Lord young rams.* 

Epistle: A reading from the Letter of the Holy Apostle Paul to the Ephesians (2: 14 - 22)

Brothers and Sisters! It is Christ who is our peace, and who made the two of us one by breaking down the barrier of hostility that kept us apart. In his own flesh he abolished the law with its commands and precepts, to create in himself one new man from us who had been two and to make peace, reconciling both of us to God in one body through his cross, which put that enmity to death. He came and "announced the good news of peace to you who were far off, and to those who were near"; through him we both have access in one Spirit to the Father. This means that you are strangers and aliens no longer. No, you are fellow citizens of the saints and members of the household of God. You form a building which rises on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the capstone. Through him the whole structure is fitted together and takes shape as a holy temple in the Lord; in him you are being built into this temple, to become a dwelling place for God in the Spirit.

Gospel: Luke 8: 41 - 56

At that time, a man named Jairus, who was chief of the synagogue, came up and fell at Jesus' feet, begging that he come to his home because his only daughter, a girl of about twelve, was dying. As Jesus went, the crowds almost crushed him. A woman with a hemorrhage of twelve years' duration, incurable at any doctor's hands, came up behind him and touched the tassel on his cloak. Immediately her bleeding stopped. Jesus asked, "Who touched me?" Everyone disclaimed doing it, while Peter said, "Lord, the crowds are milling and pressing around you!" Jesus insisted, "Someone touched me, I know that power has gone forth from me." When the woman saw that her act had not gone unnoticed, she came forward trembling. Falling at his feet, she related before the whole assemblage why she had touched him and how she had been instantly cured. Jesus said to her, "Daughter, it is your faith that has cured you. Now go in peace." He was still speaking when a man came from the ruler's house with the announcement, "Your daughter is dead; do not bother the Teacher further." Jesus heard this, and his response was: "Fear is useless, what is needed is trust and her life will be spared." Once he had arrived at the house, he permitted no one to enter with him except Peter, John, James and the child's parents. While everyone wept and lamented her, he said, "Stop crying for she is not dead but asleep." They laughed at him, being certain she was dead. He took her by the hand and spoke these words: "Get up, child." The breath of life returned to her and she got up immediately; whereupon he told them to give her something to eat. Her parents were astounded, but he ordered them not to tell anyone what had happened.
