Beloved Parishioners and Guests of St. Mary's,

Today is "*Willow Sunday*" or should I say, "*Flowery Sunday*"... a time to recall Christ's Triumphant entrance into Jerusalem – a hopefully, happy time! The KING HAS COME! But still a sad preparation for the 'crown' that Jesus would wear on Great Friday - "*a crown of thorns*"...

They waved 'palm branches' in praise of the King, we wave "pussy willows" as our sign of respect to Christ. PUSSY WILLOWS are the first blossoms to appear in spring – the first sign of NEW LIFE... and a "*Sign of Renewed Faith*" - which really means we try to live our Catholic faith this Sunday and the next and every day of the year. May we, as your pastors, lovingly, hope-fully and faithfully WELCOME you and walk with you in our spiritual journey always!

Did you know that the Great Lent has ended? Yesterday we began Holy Passion Week with Lazarus Saturday. On this day we experience the power of Jesus over death. Lazarus, Jesus' special friend, was dead for four days before Jesus brought him back to life. Thus Jesus foreshadowed the victory that He will gloriously accomplish on Easter Sunday when He finally destroys death once and for all and promises each of us who believe life everlasting.

The Holy Annunciation (*March 25th*) commemorates the appearance of Archangel Gabriel asking if Mary, a young virgin, is willing to give birth to the Son of God. This year we also happily acknowledge this feast with our Palm Flowery Sunday celebration.

This week is the most important Church week of the whole year. Our Ukrainian Church is abundantly rich with unique services all week. Each religious service has its specific historical commemoration and theme; they offer us an opportunity to experience Jesus' suffering, death and Resurrection. However, the whole purpose of the spiritual services is not just to remember what happened, but rather to enter mystically into these events and personally experience their powerful effect on us in this day and age,

It is we who are asked to die with Jesus and to rise with Him. This, in fact, takes place as we enter spiritually into the Paschal Mystery, i.e., the mystery of Jesus' Death and Resurrection. If this is not our hope and prayer, blessing an Easter basket has no real meaning! The basket symbolizes a "*holy break-fast*" - because we personally have experienced the pain of Passion Week and the ecstatic joy of Jesus' Resurrection. Again, I repeat, as believing Christians, we must allow the Truth of God's Love to enter deeply into our hearts and freely and powerfully change our lives.

Therefore we strongly and fervently encourage you to make time and attend as many of this Services as you can. And please do bring your children. It is especially important that they experience the drama of this week. Let us celebrate the Pre-Sanctified Liturgies on Monday, Tuesday & Wednesday and also receive the Sacrament of Holy Anointing. Let us re-live the washing of the feet during the Holy Thursday Liturgy and sincerely receive Jesus in Holy Communion on this sacred night. And of course, we encourage you to actively participate in the 12 Gospels at 10:00 am and in the procession of the Holy Shroud (*Plaschanitsya*) at 2:30 pm. And please do come and pray the Jerusalem Matins at 7:00 pm – the painful prayers of the Blessed Mother during this candle-lite service. This is a most poignant service and I humbly confess it is my favourite Lenten prayer service!

On Holy Saturday 2:00 pm, we witness the transformation of the 'colour' of our church, the flower pedals, the rose-scented holy water and then the blessing of the baskets in preparation for the joy and the life-giving Resurrection Service.

2018 PASTORAL LETTER OF THE UKRAINIAN CATHOLIC BISHOPS OF CANADA
ON THE OCCASION OF THE FEAST OF THE RESURRECTION OF OUR LORD

To the Very Reverend Clergy, Monastics and Religious Sisters and Brothers, Seminarians and Laity of the Ukrainian Catholic Church in Canada:

Christ is Risen! Indeed He is Risen!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Though You went down to the grave, O immortal Lord, You destroyed the power of Hades and rose victorious, Christ our God. You who said "Rejoice" to the myrrh-bearing women; give peace to Your apostles and offer resurrection to the fallen. (Easter Sunday Kondak)

Every human person longs for eternal life. Everything about how we live our daily lives points to how each of us was created for so much more than what we might encounter in our routine, and at times not-so routine, lives. After receiving so much, we still have an infinite desire for our infinite God. My soul is consumed with longing for your ordinances at all times. (Ps. 119:20) When we pause to reflect on this yearning in our hearts, we find this common, natural mystery uniting all of humanity. Indeed, salvation is both personal and communal – for each of us and for all of us.

At the same time, there are also forces that do not unite all of humanity. We witness both subtle and bold acts of greed, coercion and selfish hearts harbouring unspeakable thoughts that lead to horrible results all around us. The danger to human dignity with assisted suicide laws in Canada or the war that continues in Ukraine are but two examples. Division and destruction lead us to ask, "How can people give into such temptation and have such little regard for human dignity?"

Jesus Christ gives meaning to all things. As missionary disciples, we are challenged to share this meaningfulness with others as individuals, as families and as parishes. By recognizing our own sinfulness and God's forgiveness, we must say there is more to life than just the earthly existence of suffering when people wish to kill themselves owing to depression or chronic illness. We must show them hope. We are called to be signs of human dignity as we accompany others in their struggles to be better people, to be more like Christ, offering compassion and mercy in our common pursuit of the Truth, the person Jesus. The confusion of morals and values in society is a turbulent sea when we consider gender identity issues, suicide versus palliative care and letting one die, or being forced to agree to abortion if you apply for federal assistance for summer employment. What is needed is a harbour of trust, humility, patience and love that should be found in our vibrant parishes. Care for the body and soul of every person according to gospel values is what we must offer others. This is the fruit of internalizing the scripture, of partaking in the sacraments of the church, the fruit of common prayer, the fruit of service and charitable works.

Thus, meaningfulness in Christ is what gives purpose to life. He is present to us in all we experience. He is with us! We are invited to encounter Christ and then be a sign of hope to others so that together we proclaim, "Christ is risen from the dead, trampling death by death, and to those in the tombs giving life!" May Christ who dwells in our hearts, in our families and in our vibrant parishes, give life to all. On this Feast of the Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ, we pray that God's love fills your heart and, through you, the hearts of all. ***Christ is Risen! Indeed He is Risen!***

THE EASTER BASKET



In earlier times, meat and dairy products were excluded from the daily diet during the entire season of the Great Fast. As the end of the strict fast approached, the people showed their joy and gratitude by taking their food to Church to be blessed and eaten after the Easter Divine Liturgy. As we celebrate Easter, the Feast of New Life, we bless the food that sustains our physical life. The foods traditionally blessed for Easter are: Pascha (Easter bread), Babka (sweetbread), ham, sausage, butter, cottage cheese, eggs, horseradish, salt and pysanky (decorative and symbolic purpose only). The meaning of such variety of foods is interesting.

PASCHA - The Easter Bread, Pascha, is a large, round loaf of bread made of white flour. It is elaborately decorated with a braided cross and many rosettes. The Pascha symbolizes the joy of the New Life that is given to us by Jesus Christ.

BABKA (BABA) - The Babka is a tall, cylindrical, sweet bread enriched with raisins, butter, eggs. Saffron is added for coloring (orange-yellow). It is decorated with a simple cross. The Babka symbolizes the richness of eternal life.

HAM - The richness of this meat is symbolic of the great joy and abundance of Easter. Sometimes lamb or veal are used but these meats must be cooked well in advance so that the festivity of the day will not be burdened with the preparation.

KOBASSA - A spicy garlic sausage of pork products is indicative of God's favor and generosity.

CHEESE - Cottage Cheese, bland in taste, reminds us of the moderation that we should cultivate in our daily lives.

EGGS - Hard-boiled eggs are used. The father or the eldest in the family, if the father is not present, traditionally divides the first egg at the Easter breakfast table and shares it with each member of the family invoking an Easter blessing and greeting. The egg is symbolic of Christ's Death and Resurrection, that is, new life emerges from what appeared to be lifeless.

PYSANKY - These eggs are beautifully decorated with symbols derived from nature and later adapted to the Christian way of worship. The intricate patterns are applied with a stylus dipped in melted beeswax. The egg is dipped into successive dyes.

BUTTER - This favorite dairy product may be shaped into a lamb or decorated with whole cloves or peppercorn in the form of a cross. The butter reminds us of the goodness of Christ which in turn we should share with others.

SALT - The salt helps us to recall that we are committed to be followers of Christ and carry out His word: "You are the salt of the earth..."

HORSERADISH - The horseradish mixed with grated beets is symbolic of the Passion and Death of Christ. It reminds us of the bitterness of sin and of difficulties which we must undergo throughout our earthly life.

CANDLE - The candle, made of beeswax, is placed in the basket and lit during the blessing celebration. It is symbolic of Christ "the light of the world" who brought us the glorious good news of New Life.

COVER - The embroidered cover reminds us of Christ's shroud (white linen) and of our Baptismal robe (kryszma). Being cleansed with the Baptismal waters, we celebrate the joy of New Life by putting on the kryszma.
