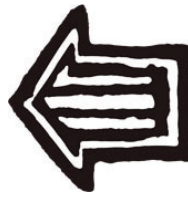

REMINDER OF THE CO-VID PROCEDURES

- 2. Please do not crowd the pews.** Only members of an immediate household should sit in a pew.
- 3. Remember to use Hand Sanitizer** when arriving at church and when leaving.
- 4. Please remember to be kind and patient.** No one wants to see anyone contact this awful virus.
- 5. No Shaking Hands or Kissing Icons or the Gospel**
- 6. Divine Liturgy Books:** Use one and then take it home. Do not leave it in the pew. It will be yours to bring to each Divine Liturgy.
- 7. Receiving Communion:** Please stay in your pew, Father will come to you and will place the host in your folded hands
- 8. No Gathering:** Please no "gathering" or "visiting" together inside the church or the church grounds.
- 9. Let's all pray that a vaccine will be ready soon.** That is how we can return to normal. We should also remember those who cannot attend church because of a compromised immune system.

SCAM ALERT - Please be aware that fraudulent messages continue to circulate via e-mail, as well as via text and messaging apps, allegedly coming from our priests, bishop, or others in the Catholic community, asking for money, gift cards, or other gifts. **Please DISREGARD all such messages!** Do NOT reply or engage with the individuals sending these messages. The email addresses typically look like they could be real. The message asks if you are busy, ask for a favour, or directly ask for iTunes or other gift cards or funds. **Do NOT send gift cards, money, or cash transfers if requested to do so over e-mail or via text message.** This applies to any such messages that people receive, not just clergy or from clergy! It could look like it is coming from friends or relatives, however the email will always be just a little different than what the real one is, or the name might be just a bit different as well. **Check the email address that the message is coming from** – our clergy email addresses are on our Eparchial website under the Eparchy Tab – Clergy & Religious! For example, if you received an email from bishop.bryanbayda.skeparchy@gmail.com do not respond to it! **Just block the sender and delete the email! Under no circumstance should you go and purchase gift cards or send any money, etc!** Therefore, if you receive messages asking for help like this from our bishops or priests, either contact their offices directly to check whether they are authentic, or just ignore.

If you are the victim of fraud, contact your local police or RCMP office.

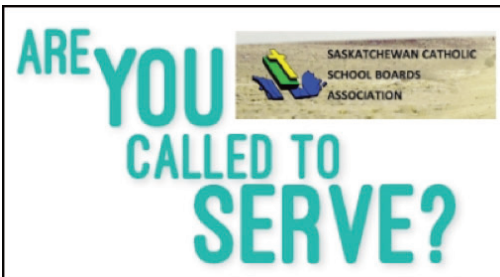

Tropar, tone 8: You came down from on high, O Merciful One,* and accepted three days of burial* to free us from our sufferings.* O Lord, our life and our resurrection,* glory be to You.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and forever and ever. Amen!

Kondak, tone 8: When You rose from the tomb, You also raised the dead and resurrected Adam.* Eve exults in Your resurrection,* and the ends of the world celebrate Your rising from the dead,* O most merciful One.

Prokimen, tone 8: Pray and give praise to the Lord our God.

Verse: In Judea God is known; His name is great in Israel.

Epistle: A reading from the Letter of the Holy Apostle Paul to Corinthians. (6: 16 - 7:1)

Brothers and Sisters! You are the temple of the living God, just as God has said: "I will dwell with them and walk among them. I will be their God and they shall be my people. Therefore, 'Come out from among them,' says the Lord; 'and touch nothing unclean. I will welcome you and be a father to you and you will be my sons and daughters,' says the Lord Almighty." Since we have these promises, beloved, let us purify ourselves from every defilement of flesh and spirit, and in the fear of God strive to fulfill our consecration perfectly.

Gospel: Matthew 15: 21 - 28

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and forever and ever. Amen!

Kondak tone 1: You arose in glory from the tomb* and with Yourself You raised the world.* All humanity acclaims You as God, and death has vanished.* Adam exults, O Master,* and Eve, redeemed now from bondage, cries out for joy:* "You are the One, O Christ, Who offer resurrection to all."

Prokimen, tone 1: Let Your mercy, O Lord, be upon us, as we have hoped in You.

Verse: Rejoice in the Lord, O you just; praise befits the righteous.

Epistle: A reading from the 2nd Letter of the Holy Apostle Paul to the Corinthians. (9: 6 - 11)

Brothers and Sisters! He who sows sparingly will reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will reap bountifully. Everyone must give according to what he has inwardly decided; not sadly, not grudgingly, for God loves a cheerful giver. God can multiply his favors among you so that you may always have enough of everything and even a surplus for good works, as it is written: "He scattered abroad and gave to the poor, his justice endures forever." He who supplies seed for the sower and bread for the eater will provide in abundance; he will multiply the seed you sow and increase your generous yield. In every way your liberality is enriched; through us it results in thanks offered to God.

Making great the salvation of the king, and showing mercy to His anointed, to David, and to His posterity for ever.

Gospel: Luke 5: 1 - 11

At that time as he stood by the Lake of Gennesaret, and the crowd pressed in on him to hear the word of God, he saw two boats moored by the side of the lake; the fishermen had disembarked and were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to pull out a short distance from the shore; then, remaining seated, he continued to teach the crowds from the boat. When he had finished speaking he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch." Simon answered, "Master, we have been hard at it all night long and have caught nothing; but if you say so, I will lower the nets." Upon doing this they caught such a great number of fish that their nets were at the breaking point. They signaled to their mates in the other boat to come and help them. These came, and together they filled the two boats until they nearly sank. At the sight of this, Simon Peter fell at the knees of Jesus saying, "Leave me, Lord. I am a sinful man." For indeed, amazement at the catch they had made seized him and all his shipmates, as well as James and John, Zedede's sons, who were partners with Simon. Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid. From now on you will be catching men." With that they brought their boats to land, left everything, and became his followers.
