Reconciliation & First Solemn Holy Communion 2023

First Holy Communion is considered one of the holiest and most important occasions in a Catholic person's life. It is the first time that a person receives the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist, which is the eating of consecrated bread and drinking of consecrated wine.

The children will also be preparing for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. This sacrament allows us to show them that God loves us and shows us mercy, and He is always ready to forgive, no matter what the wrong. It assures them that God already knows the secrets of our hearts and we can put our trust in Him.

Your child will attend First Communion on the following Sundays from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm. Please pack your child a water bottle and something to snack on during breaks. Class is from 9-11am with Divine Liturgy to follow. Your child can be picked up after church. I encourage you to attend liturgy as well to set an example for your child while they attend their Sacrament classes.

April 2, 9, 16, 23, 30
May 7, 13, 14

The dates on the Ukrainian dance competition weekends may be rescheduled if the students cannot attend because they are competing on that Sunday. Once you get your dance schedule for the competition, please let me know if your child dances on a Sunday morning that we have class. Rescheduling a class may include making up for it on a Saturday. All the classes are in a certain order according to the liturgy that is celebrated that Sunday. All classes are mandatory to complete the program and receive your First Holy Communion. Please try to make these three months a priority and a commitment on your part. Your child will do their First Reconciliation on May 7th. We will have a rehearsal for their First Communion on May 13th, followed by a closing party.

First Holy Communion will be held on May 14th. I will send detailed instructions about this event in a separate email. Please talk to your child about the upcoming classes and the expectations and outcomes. Preparing them to receive this sacrament will be very helpful. is a link you can read to prepare.

**TROPARS, KONDAKS, EPISTLE & GOSPEL FOR
SUNDAY, JANUARY 22 ~ ZACCHEUS SUNDAY**



Sunday Tropar, tone 8 : You came down from on high, O Merciful One,* and accepted three days of burial* to free us from our sufferings.* O Lord, our life and our resurrection,* glory be to You.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and for ever and ever. Amen!

Kondak, tone 8: When You rose from the tomb,* You also raised the dead and resurrected Adam.* Eve exults in Your resurrection,* and the ends of the world celebrate Your rising from the dead,* O most merciful One.

Prokimen, tone 8: Pray and give praise to the Lord our God.

Verse: In Judea God is known; His name is great in Israel.

Epistle: A reading from the first Letter of the Holy Apostle Paul to Timothy 4: 9 - 15

Timothy, my son! You can depend on this as worthy of complete acceptance. This explains why we work and struggle as we do; our hopes are fixed on the living God who is the savior of all men, but especially of those who believe. Such are the things you must urge and teach. Let no one look down on you because of your youth, but be a continuing example of love, faith, and purity to believers. Until I arrive, devote yourself to the reading of Scripture, to preaching and teaching. Do not neglect the gift you received when, as a result of prophecy, the presbyters laid their hands on you. Attend to your duties; let them absorb you, so that everyone may see your progress.

Alleluia Verses:

Come, let us rejoice in the Lord; let us acclaim God our Savior.

Let us come before His countenance with praise and acclaim Him with psalms.

Gospel: Luke 19: 1 - 10

At that time Jesus was passing through Jericho. There was a man there named Zaccheus, the chief tax collector and a wealthy man. He was trying to see what Jesus was like, but being small of stature, was unable to do so because of the crowd. He first ran on in front, then climbed a sycamore tree which was along Jesus' route, in order to see him. When Jesus came to the spot he looked up and said, "Zaccheus, hurry down. I mean to stay at your house today." He quickly descended, and welcomed him with delight. When this was observed, everyone began to murmur, "He has gone to a sinner's house as a guest." Zaccheus stood his ground and said to the Lord: "I give half my belongings, Lord, to the poor. If I have defrauded anyone in the least, I pay him back four-fold." Jesus said to him: "Today salvation has come to this house, for this is what it means to be a son of Abraham. The Son of Man has come to search out and save what was lost."

THE PUBLICAN AND THE PHARISEE



Sunday Tropar, tone 1 : Though the stone was sealed by the Jews* and soldiers guarded Your most pure body,* You arose, O Savior, on the third day,* and gave life to the world.* And so the heavenly powers cried out to You, O Giver of life:* Glory to Your resurrection, O Christ!* Glory to Your kingdom!* Glory to Your saving plan,* O only Lover of Mankind.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and for ever and ever. Amen!

Kondak of the Publican and the Pharisee, tone 3: Let us bring the groans of the Publican to the Lord,* and as sinners let us prostrate ourselves before Him, our Master,* for he wants salvation for all men.* He offers forgiveness to all who repent.* He became flesh for our sake,* God though he was, co-eternal with the Father.

Prokimen, tone 1: Let Your mercy, O Lord, be upon us, as we have hoped in You.

Verse: Rejoice in the Lord, O you just; praise befits the righteous.

Epistle: A reading from the 2nd Letter of the Holy Apostle Paul to the Timothy 3: 10 - 15

Timothy, my son! You have followed closely my teaching and my conduct. You have observed my resolution, fidelity, patience, love and endurance, through persecution and sufferings in Antioch, Iconium, and Lystra. You know what persecutions I have had to bear, and you know how the Lord saved me from them all. Anyone who wants to live a godly life in Christ Jesus can expect to be persecuted. But all the while evil men and charlatans will go from bad to worse, deceiving others, themselves deceived. You, for your part, must remain faithful to what you have learned and believed, because you know who your teachers were. Likewise, from your infancy you have known the sacred Scriptures, the source of the wisdom which through faith in Jesus Christ leads to salvation.

Alleluia Verses: *God gives me vindication, and has subdued peoples under me. Making great the salvation of the king, and showing mercy to His anointed, to David, and to His posterity for ever.*

Gospel: Luke 18: 10 - 14

The Lord told this parable: "Two men went up to the temple to pray; one was a Pharisee, the other a tax collector. The pharisee with head unbowed prayed in this fashion: 'I give you thanks, O God, that I am not like the rest of men -- grasping, crooked, adulterous -- or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week, I pay tithes on all I possess.' The other man, however, kept his distance, not even daring to raise his eyes to heaven. All he did was beat his breast and say, 'O God, be merciful to me, a sinner.' Believe me, this man went home from the temple justified but the other did not. For everyone who exalts himself shall be humbled while he who humbles himself shall be exalted."

Communion Hymn:

Praise the Lord from the heavens, praise Him in the highest.
