RE: Pastoral Appointments and District changes in the Eparchy of Saskatoon effective August 1, 2023

Metropolitan Lawrence Huculak, O.S.B.M., Apostolic Administrator of the Eparchy of Saskatoon, has issued the following new pastoral appointments and approved the following changes to pastoral districts, *commencing on August 1, 2023:*

- Fr. Basil Malowany is appointed as Administrator of the newly defined **Yorkton-Ituna District**, with Fr. Deacon Ivan Simko as Assistant-Administrator (following his expected ordination to the priesthood).
- Fr. Jeffrey Stephaniuk will serve as Administrator in the newly defined Wynyard District.
- Fr. Andrei Kachur will serve as Administrator in the newly defined Prince Albert- Cudworth District, with Fr. Deacon Harrold Salahub as Assistant to the Administrator.
- Fr. Ivan Nahachewsky is appointed Rector of the Cathedral of St. George in Saskatoon, and will continue to exercise responsibilities as Vicar-General, Chancellor and Vicar of Properties.
- Hieromonk Gregory Hrynkiv will be relieved of his responsibilities in the Cudworth District with the exception of the Shrine of Our Lady of Sorrows in Cudworth.
- Fr. Ray Lukie, C.Ss.R., will remain as Pastor of Ss. Peter and Paul Ukrainian Catholic Church in Saskatoon, with Fr. Dmytro Dnistrian, C.Ss.R., as Assistant-Pastor.
- Fr. Leonid Malkov, C.Ss.R., is appointed as Administrator of the North Battleford & Hafford Districts and as Chaplain to the Ukrainian Catholic Sisters of St. Joseph of Saskatoon, with his residence being with the Redemptorist Fathers in Saskatoon.
- Fr. Yevhen Zadorozhnyi, C.Ss.R., has been reassigned to serve in Winnipeg and will be relieved of his duties in Yorkton.
- Fr. Joakim Rac's retirement has been accepted. An announcement regarding his replacement will be forthcoming.

The following appointments remain unchanged:

- Fr. André Lalach will continue as Administrator of Dormition of the Blessed Mother of God Church in Saskatoon & District.
- Fr. Vasyl Tymishak will continue as Administrator of St. Athanasius Church in Regina and Moose Jaw District.
- Fr. Warren Dungen will continue as Administrator of St. Basil Church in Regina and Montmartre District.

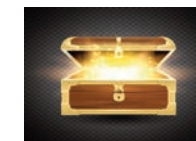

Epistle: A reading from the Acts of the Apostles 2: 1 - 11

When the day of Pentecost came it found them gathered in one place. Suddenly from up in the sky there came a noise like a strong, driving wind which was heard all through the house where they were seated. Tongues of fire appeared which parted and came to rest on each of them. All were filled with the Holy Spirit. They began to express themselves in foreign tongues and make bold proclamation as the Spirit prompted them. Staying in Jerusalem at the time were devout Jews of every nation under heaven. These heard the sound, and assembled in a large crowd. They were much confused because each one heard these men speaking his own language. The whole occurrence astonished them. They asked in utter amazement, "Are not all of these men who are speaking Galileans? How is it that each of us hears them in his native tongue? We are Parthians, Medes, and Elamites. We live in Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus, the province of Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt, and the regions of Libya around Cyrene. There are even visitors from Rome -- all Jews, or those who have come over to Judaism; Cretans and Arabs too. Yet each of us hears them speaking in his own tongue about the marvels God has accomplished."

Gospel: John 7: 37 - 52, 8: 12

On the last and greatest day of the festival, Jesus stood up and cried out: "If anyone thirsts, let him come to me; let him drink who believes in me. Scripture has it: 'From within him rivers of living water shall flow.'" (Here he was referring to the Spirit, whom those that came to believe in him were to receive. There was, of course, no Spirit as yet, since Jesus had not yet been glorified.) Some in the crowd who heard these words began to say, "This must be the Prophet." Others were claiming, "He is the Messiah." But an objection was raised: "Surely the Messiah is not to come from Galilee? Does not Scripture say that the Messiah, being of David's family, is to come from Bethlehem, the village where David lived?" In this fashion the crowd was sharply divided over him. Some of them even wanted to apprehend him. However, no one laid hands on him. When the temple guards came back, the chief priests and Pharisees asked them, "Why did you not bring him in?" "No man ever spoke like that before," the guards replied. "Do not tell us you too have been taken in!" the Pharisees retorted. "You do not see any of the Sanhedrin believing him, do you? Or the Pharisees? Only this lot, that knows nothing about the law -- and they are lost anyway!" One of their own number, Nicodemus (the man who had come to him), spoke up to say, "Since when does our law condemn any man without first hearing him and knowing the facts?" Do not tell us you are a Galilean too," they taunted him. "Look it up. You will not find the Prophet coming from Galilee." Jesus spoke to them once again: "I am the light of the world. No follower of mine shall ever walk in darkness; no, he shall possess the light of life."

Instead of 'It is truly right': O my soul, extol the One God* in three persons.* Rejoice, O Queen* and glorious Virgin Mother!* What orator, rich in eloquence,* could find the proper words to fashion a hymn of praise worthy of you?* For every spirit shudders* before the mystery of your holy birthgiving;* and we also unite our voices* to glorify you.

Prokimen, tone 8: Pray and give praise to the Lord our God.

Verse: *God is renowned in Judah, in Israel great is his name.*

Epistle: A reading from the Epistle to the Hebrews 11: 33 - 12: 2

Brothers and Sisters! All who by faith conquered kingdoms, did what was just, obtained the promises; they broke the jaws of lions, put out raging fires, escaped the devouring sword; though weak they were made powerful, became strong in battle, and turned back foreign invaders. Women received back their dead through resurrection. Others were tortured and would not receive deliverance, in order to obtain a better resurrection. Still others endured mockery, scourging, even chains and imprisonment. They were stoned, sawed in two, put to death at sword's point; they went about garbed in the skins of sheep or goats, needy, afflicted, tormented. The world was not worthy of them. They wandered about in deserts and on mountains, they dwelt in caves and in holes of the earth. Yet despite the fact that all of these were approved because of their faith, they did not obtain what had been promised. God had made a better plan, a plan which included us. Without us, they were not to be made perfect. Therefore, since we for our part are surrounded by this cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every encumbrance of sin which clings to us and persevere in running the race which lies ahead; let us keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, who inspires and perfects our faith.

Gospel: Matthew 10: 32 - 33, 37 - 38, 19: 27 - 30

The Lord said to his disciples: "Whoever acknowledges me before men I will acknowledge before my Father in heaven. Whoever disowns me before men I will disown before my Father in heaven. Whoever loves father or mother, son or daughter, more than me is not worthy of me. He who will not take up his cross and come after me is not worthy of me." Then it was Peter's turn to say to him: "Here we have put everything aside to follow you. What can we expect from it?" Jesus said to them, "I give you my solemn word, in the new age when the Son of Man takes his seat upon a throne befitting his glory, you who have followed me shall likewise take your places on twelve thrones to judge the twelve tribes of Israel. Moreover, everyone who has given up home, brothers or sisters, father or mother, wife or children or property for my sake will receive many times as much and inherit everlasting life. Many who are first shall come last, and the last shall come first."
